

South Korean violinist Ji in Yang regularly appears with ensembles in the United States and all the major orchestras in Korea, including the KBS Symphony Orchestra, Bucheon Philharmonic Orchestra, Suwon Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Ulsan Philharmonic



Orchestra and collaborates with some of the world's leading musicians. She holds a bachelor's and master's degrees from the Juilliard School and graduated from Yale University with an Artist Diploma. Currently she's pursuing a Doctor of Musical Arts at City University of New York. She plays a Petrus Guarnerius violin made in Venice in 1723.

Soprano Shana Blake Hill is known for creating and premiering new roles and contemporary works, as well as bringing a thoughtful and modern perspective to the heroines of the standard repertoire. Critics have described her as a "fearless actress" and as "visually and vocally voluptuous." She has sung principal roles with: the Los Angeles Opera, Savonlinna Festival Opera, Dayton Opera



Cincinnati Opera, Long Beach Opera Santa Barbara Opera, and many others.

He solos frequently with the Verdi Chorus. In addition, he has performed internationally with



the Shanghai Opera and at the Kennedy Center with the Philippine National Opera.
